



Central Louisiana Regional Housing Priorities 2021

- **Create designated revenue streams for local and statewide Housing Trust Funds to increase affordable housing production**
- Increasing Capital (increase existing funding to create more housing, secure new funding sources, and use current resources more efficiently)
- Address Census 2021 barriers and support an accurate and complete count
- Recruit more local developers to partner with and commit to affordable housing development
- Educate residents about HUD Section 3
- Ensure that affordable housing does not equate to substandard housing by setting habitability requirements for landlords and the city to abide by, such as a Rental Registry
- Create a comprehensive housing strategy that addresses title and succession issues to create more affordable housing
- Create more access and opportunities to create change through community power and engagement by addressing gate keepers that keep the status quo in place
- Education and Community Engagement Around Affordable Housing
- Invest in sustainable development for quality neighborhoods as well as weatherization upgrades for older housing stock
- Address zoning and redistricting issues that prevent the development of affordable housing
- Creating more jobs for low-income residents
- Develop a housing referral system for vulnerable populations that have a hard time finding affordable housing in the city
- Creating a Comprehensive Housing Plan
